

# Coyotes Prepare For 'Memory Week' At Montana

It's memory week at the University of South Dakota. And that brings mixed feelings for head football coach Joe Glenn and his Coyotes (1-1), who play at No. 4 Montana on Saturday. On the one hand, Glenn has fond memories of time at the University of Montana. He was an assistant for the Grizzlies for six years in the 1980s and later came back as the head coach from 2000-02, where he won an FCS title in 2001. Glenn, now 65, called Washington-Grizzly Stadium in Missoula "perhaps" the best FCS venue in the country — a facility where Montana is 53-8 since 2006. "It's certainly a challenge to go in there and get a victory, but that's

the mission," Glenn said Tuesday during his weekly teleconference. On the other hand for South Dakota, however, it nearly pulled off a win against the nationally-ranked Grizzlies last season in Vermillion — only losing on a 98-yard kickoff return with under two minutes left. And so, that game was understandably brought up during Glenn's annual visit back to Missoula. "It's all they want to talk about," he said. "It was really tough. We had played a great game," he added. "For the game to end in the last six minutes ... it just didn't seem right for our team to lose like that." South Dakota came into last season's November meeting at the DakotaDome already with some bitter feelings. A week earlier, the Coyotes had

a late lead on No. 10 Youngstown State before surrendering a touchdown run with 14 seconds left. Then against the Grizzlies, USD had a 223-52 edge in rushing yards, but surrendered a kickoff return for a touchdown with 1:36 remaining, losing 31-27. Glenn said his assessment after that game was that his program needed to get better athletes on the field to "close the game down." "We've got to produce wins when the game is close, and that's all there is to it," he said. With the way USD's schedule was mapped out, the trip to Montana would be its first FCS test of the season. The Coyotes have played a top-5 FBS program in Oregon (losing by 49 points) and an NIAA program in William Penn (winning by 25). South Dakota can finally get a

true gauge of where it stands after the Montana game, Glenn said Tuesday. "At least we're recruiting out of the same pool of people," he said. **SDSU Also Heads West** The South Dakota State football team also heads west this weekend to play a Big Sky Conference member. The No. 11-ranked Jackrabbits (1-1), however, will head to Cedar City, Utah, to face Southern Utah (0-2) in a battle of FCS playoff teams from a year ago. It marks the second consecutive week SDSU will play a Big Sky team, and both Cal Poly and Southern Utah are both previous members of the Great West Conference. The Thunderbirds have suffered losses this season to FBS Nevada

and then to Southeastern Louisiana, the No. 3 team in the FCS ranks. "They're probably one of the teams I've seen on film that are very consistent in what they do," SDSU head coach John Stiegelmeier said Tuesday. Consistency also marks Stiegelmeier's tenure in Brookings. A victory Saturday would be the 113th in his career and would put him in a tie atop the SDSU all-time list, with Ralph Ginn (who coached from 1947-68). "It's a neat thing to be part of it," Stiegelmeier said. "I say, that as a football coach, you have so many people involved in a program. "It's fun to be part of potentially setting that record.
