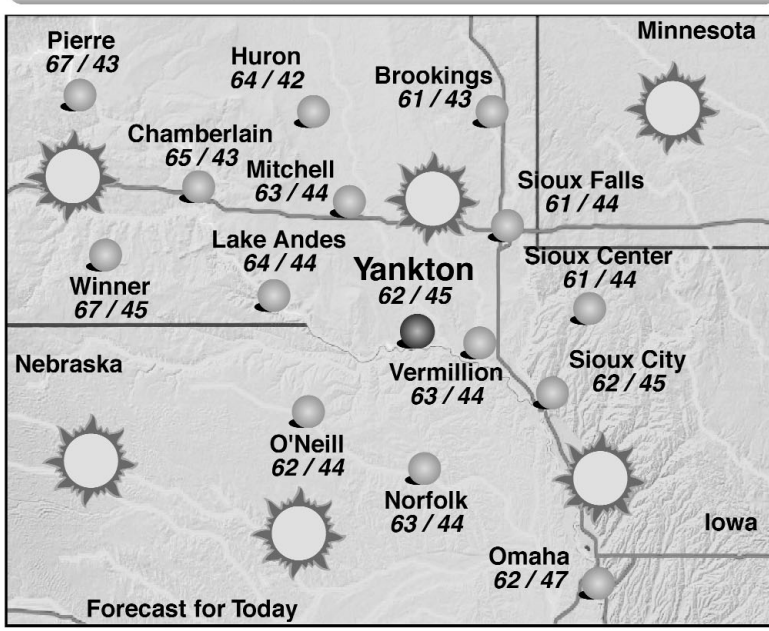

NEW YORK (AP) — The stock market logged its first weekly loss since early August on Friday after a report showed that retail sales in August rose more than economists had forecast.

History Volunteers Turn Out Thursday

Nearly 50 people showed up at the historic Mead Building on Thursday night as volunteers to help explain the Historic Preservation Ordinance that will be on the November ballot in Yankton County.

"We would have been happy with a 10 or 20," said Bernie Hunhoff, chair of the Historic Preservation Commission that asked the county commission to place the ordinance on the ballot.

The volunteers learned about the benefits of the project. Crystal Nelson, director of the Dakota Territorial Museum, reported that nearly half of the \$4.7 million project has already been committed.

who provide grants. Governor Dennis Daugaard recently toured the facility to check on the progress and was pleasantly surprised at all the work that has been accomplished.

Jim Means, vice chair of the preservation commission, explained that a "yes" vote will not raise taxes for property owners because the mill levy being requested for historic preservation must fit within the county's current spending limits.

Means said it will be a tiny part of the county's budget but will allow the museum to have predictable public support.

Hunhoff told the volunteers that the Mead Building will provide space for a children's museum, exhibits on the Mis-

souri River and the legacy of the community's caring for the mentally ill, among other things. "It will also give us space to explain to youth the importance of our agricultural heritage.

"No other community in the West will have a museum like this," he said. "Not Deadwood. Not Pierre. Not Sioux Falls and not Omaha.

The 50 volunteers will help to explain the project to friends and neighbors. Another volunteer meeting will be held Oct. 16 at 7 p.m. at the GAR Hall.

bringing that here ... and investing further in their building and our community. It does nothing but good in terms of additional real estate tax revenues, additional employment and additional activity for the Yankton economy.

Clifton said the expansion will help the company enhance services to existing and potential customers. "The fact that we're able to expand our business to serve our current customers and expand our customer base with new customers in new (fields), such as auto-

motive — which is becoming a very big segment in aluminum extrusion ... (it) is an honor that we were chosen as one of two plants in the United States for a press expansion."

The other press expansion will take place in Elkhart, Indiana. Sapa Group, based in Norway, employs 23,000 in more than 40 countries.

Stephenson said he sees the move as a commitment by Sapa to the area and that there could potentially be more growth in the future. "It's additional commitment from Sapa (Group) in Yankton," he said.

building a large enough new building that maybe future expansion beyond this can be possible years down the road if and when the company grows into it and there's that kind of demand for additional product."

He added the expansion also benefits other existing manufacturers in Yankton.

"Them being here in our community with all the aluminum that gets extruded by them and gets sold here in town is a net benefit for the manufacturers we have in town that use their product," he said.

Clifton said there will be other benefits to the community as well from the influx of new workers.

"It's going to be a plus for the community because of the additional people we're going to employ, additional revenue that will come into the city through the salaries that we'll be paying these people," he said.
