## Vikings' Adrian Peterson Accused Of Child Abuse

MINNEAPOLIS (AP) — Star Minnesota Vikings running back Adrian Peterson has been indicted in Texas on a charge of child abuse after using a branch to spank his son, and was swiftly benched by the team on Friday for this weekend's game against New England.

Peterson's attorney, Rusty Hardin, said that the charge in Montgomery County accuses Peterson of using a branch, or switch, to spank one of his sons, whose age was not disclosed. Hardin said Peterson has cooperated with authorities and didn't mean any harm.

"Adrian is a loving father who used his judgment as a parent to discipline his son. He used the same kind of discipline with his child that he experienced as a child growing up in east Texas," Hardin said. "Adrian has never hidden

from what happened. He has cooperated fully with authorities and voluntarily testified before

the grand jury for several hours. Adrian will address the charges with the same respect and responsiveness he has brought to this inquiry from its beginning. It is important to remember that Adrian never intended to harm his son and deeply regrets the unintentional

injury." The Vikings, about an hour after issuing a statement acknowledging the case but deferring questions to Hardin, said Peterson would be on the inactive list for their home opener against New England.

A warrant has been issued for Peterson's arrest, and he will have to turn himself in. There is no timeline for when he will appear in Texas, his attorney said.

"We are just obligated to try to get it done as soon as possible, which we intend to honor," he said.

The allegations came during a week in which the NFL has

been under heavy criticism and scrutiny for the way it handled a domestic violence case involving former Baltimore Ravens running back Ray Rice and his then-fiancee. An independent investigation headed by former FBI director Robert Mueller has been convened to look into the handling of the Rice situation. Commissioner Roger Goodell initially suspended Rice for just two games. After a longer version of security video surfaced on Monday showing Rice punching her in the face, the Ravens released Rice and the league suspended him indefinitely.

Critics are also closely watching how the league proceeds in the cases of Carolina Panthers defensive end Greg Hardy and Ray McDonald of the San Francisco 49ers, both still playing with domestic abuse cases pending. Hardy was convicted July 15 of assaulting a woman and communicating

threats, but is appealing. San Jose police are still actively investigating an Aug. 31 incident involving McDonald

The NFL didn't immediately respond to a request for comment on Peterson's situation.

A man who identified himself as Peterson's uncle, Chris Peterson, answered the door at the running back's home in Eden Prairie, Minnesota, and said Peterson wasn't there and that the family had no comment.

Peterson is in his eighth season, all of them with the Vikings. Widely considered the best running back in the league, he has rushed for 10,190 yards and 86 touchdowns in his career. Peterson did not practice on Thursday because of what coach Mike Zimmer called a "veteran day," allowing experienced players to rest, but Peterson was at the team facility that day and spoke to reporters about the upcoming game against the Patriots.

Nine months after celebrating a Mountain West championship in their final home game of 2013, Fresno State returns to Bulldog Sta-dium with little to feel good about.

The post-Derek Carr era has gotten off to a rough start with lopsided road losses to powerhouse Southern Califor-

nia and fellow Pac-12 team Utah. Things don't figure to get much easier in the home opener Saturday night when the Bulldogs (0-2) host another national power in Nebraska (2-0).

'You get punched in the nose twice, you have to respond," Fresno State coach Tim DeRuyter said. "Last year, we didn't have a whole lot of adversity.

The Bulldogs have allowed the most points in the

nation through two weeks (111), having lost 52-13 to USC and 59-27 to Utah. The Cornhuskers faced their own kind of test last

week when McNeese State of the lower-division FCS played Nebraska to a tie until the final minute of a 31-24 loss.

That dropped Nebraska from No. 19 in the Associated Press poll to unranked. Since the AP poll expanded to 25 teams in 1989, no team ranked as high had ever dropped out after a win.

I think our guys will respond very well," coach Bo Pelini said. "I'm not worried about what's happened to Fresno, what their record is or how they've played. Our challenge is to play and execute at a high level. Our focus is on us. On the way we'll get ready for Fresno.'
