SDSU's Zenner Named To AFCA Good Works Team

BROOKINGS — South Dakota State University running back Zach Zenner was named Tuesday to the 2014 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team for his community service efforts.

For more than two decades the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team has been one of the most esteemed awards in college sports. This summer, the program received a record 182 nominations from colleges and universities across the country. A voting panel comprised of former Allstate AFCA Good Works Team members and college football media reviewed the nominees in an effort to select 11 players from the NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision and 11 players from the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision, Divisions II, III and the NAIA to comprise the 22-player team.

A senior from Eagan, Minnesota, Zenner was presented his award during an event Tuesday morning at Hillcrest Elementary School in Brookings. Zenner has served a key role in numerous community service events as president of the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee, including Summit League Food Fight (yearly competition among league schools for donations to local food pantry), Project Joy (holiday toy drive) and campus cleanup. He also has worked the past three years with the State-A-Thon event to raise money for the Children's Miracle Network and has devoted countless hours to the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, including coaching children on fundamental football skills, leading devotions at FCA Power Camp and speaking to area youth groups at other FCA events.

This past winter, Zenner served as a student-athlete ambassador, testifying before state House and Senate Appropriations committees as the state Legislature debated passage of a bill to authorize construction of a new on-campus football stadium.

Zenner's lengthy community service résumé extends beyond the campus and local community as he was one of 25 SDSU student-athletes who traveled to Harmon, Jamaica, in March 2014 on a mission trip to help build two homes and interact with members of the village through the Won by One

organization.

Zenner is the second Jackrabbit student-athlete in as many years to be named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team, joining 2013 honoree Winston Wright.

Lineman Of The Week

VERMILION — South Dakota sophomore left guard Nile Banks has been named the Missouri Valley Football Conference Offensive Lineman of the Week for his performance in the Coyotes' 28-21 win against No. 23 Northern Arizona Saturday.

It is the first such honor for Banks, who hails from Iowa City, Iowa. Banks was part of a power run game that surpassed 300 yards rushing and averaged 5.4 yards per carry. Quarterback Ryan Saeger rushed for a career-high 108 yards and his two touchdown runs were sneaks to left of the center.

South Dakota ran seven straight times and gained three first downs to get inside the 10 before throwing a touchdown that made it 28-14 early in the fourth quarter. Northern Arizona kicked off with 4:12 remaining after making it a one-score game, but didn't get the ball back. The Coyotes ran five straight times to drain the clock, converting a third-and-four and a second-and-four for first downs.

Reddy, Bidarkal Win At Gopher Invitational

MINNEAPOLIS — Freshman Sanjana Bidarkal won the Minneapolis Flight while senior Yamini Reddy won the St. Paul Flight as South Dakota tennis competed at the Gopher Invitational this past weekend.

Bidarkal, who has a 6-1 record after two tournaments this fall, started her run by sweeping Northern Iowa's Sydney Wolfe (6-2, 6-3), then dropped Kate Lanier of Kentucky in three sets (4-6, 6-4, 1-0 (8)). Her final match of the tournament was a 6-2, 6-4 sweep of UW-Milwaukee's Christina Colarossi in the semis. She was awarded the Minneapolis Flight's title by default over UNI's Gisele Kemper.

Reddy started off the St. Paul Flight by topping North Dakota's Alizza Deming (6-1, 6-1). She followed up by beating UNI's Savannah Hunt (1-6, 6-3, 1-0 (9)) and UW-Milwaukee's Hayley Marshall in the championship (6-4, 2-6, 1-0 (4)).

Teammate Nina Barudzic placed third in the St. Paul Flight. She swept Maria Laura Velazco of SDSU (7-6 (4), 6-2) before losing to Marshall in the semifinals (4-6, 6-4, 1-0 (10)). She was awarded third place by default over Northern Illinois.

South Dakota will compete at the UNI Invitational this weekend in Cedar Falls, Iowa. That tournament will start on Friday and ends on Sunday.
