OMAHA, Neb. (AP) — A class of two men and two women will be inducted into the Nebraska Omaha Athletics Hall of Fame next month. The inductees are volleyball player Tracy Ankeny, soccer player Stephanie Kruse, football player Marv Nevins and wrestler Les Sigman. They'll be honored during the Night of Honor hosted by the UNO Alumni Association on Oct. 9. Ankeny was a two-time first-team All-American in the late 1990s. Kruse was the 2002 North Central Conference player of the year. Nevins was a lineman on Omaha University's 1955 Tangerine Bowl team. Sigman was part of three national championship teams from 2003-06 and the winningest wrestler in school history.

USA Track Bids To Host 2019 World Championships

INDIANAPOLIS (AP) — USA Track and Field has submitted a bid to host the 2019 world championships in Eugene, Oregon. If selected, this would be the first time the track competition has been held in the U.S. since the event began in 1983. Barcelona, Spain, and Doha, Qatar, are also up for consideration. The International Association of Athletic Federations council will make a decision Nov. 18 in Monaco. USA Track submitted the bid along with TrackTown USA, which served as the local organizing committee for the 2014 world junior championships in Eugene two months ago. Max Siegel, the CEO of USA Track, says his organization "considers it a duty and an honor" to host international competitions. The world championships are held every two years. Beijing will host in 2015 and London in 2017.

Both McClure and Lavin feel they are on track to have a strong finish to their respective seasons. "I need more training, but I know where I need to work," Lavin said. "I hope it pays off at state."

In the varsity boys' race, Norfolk finished 1-2 with Tejai Clausen (17:27.10) beating out Andrew Meuret (17:43.36) for top honors in the 5,000-meter event. For Clausen, it was a good opportunity to race against

the same meet twice in a row. Yankton was at the Norfolk Invitational a week ago. "We knew Yankton is a good team. We knew it wouldn't be an easy race," he said. "We've been working hard and we knew if we worked together we would do well."

Clausen attacked the course despite the warm conditions. "I knew the course was flat and fast," he said. "I went out slow and ran my own race."

Yankton was led by senior Paul Fanta's (18:04.37) sixth place finish. After their lead runner crossed the finish line, the Bucks put eight more across in the next minute: Brady Jaquith (10th, 10:21.09), Nathan Zimmerman (11th, 18:31.11), Andrew Peitz (14th, 18:43.36), Sam Gusso (15th, 18:46.61), Kyle Bergeson (16th, 18:50.91), Brody McClure (18th, 19:00.25) and

Also for Yankton, Joseph Kelly (19:35.14) finished 22nd, Gabe Dannenbring (19:43.69) placed 24th, Jordan Lucht (20:08.92) placed 28th, Ethan Brausey (20:55.29) placed 29th and Javier Flores (22:04.27) placed 30th. "It's nice to run in a pack. They're all about the same ability level," Coach Dannenbring said. "Our places 2-3-4-5-6 take turns on who is having a good day and who is not."

Having a "good day" for the Bucks on Thursday were Jaquith, a freshman, and Zimmerman, an eighth grader. "They ran great races to be 10th and 11th," Coach Dannenbring said. "I thought all our guys ran well. This field was pretty salty."
