"The doctor came back in the room, looked at Brendan and said 'Brendan, you are a very sick boy," Marc said.
"She said his blood work showed that his platelets were extremely low -so low, that they wouldn't let me drive him to the hospital in Sioux Falls — they wanted to fly him there by helicopter."

Marc said if Brendan were to get a nose bleed while driving to Sioux Falls, he would have bled out.

'She told me she thought it might be leukemia, but that they needed to do the tests in Sioux Falls," he said. "I had to go home, explain to my wife what was going on. We had to race to Sioux Falls, and all the time I was thinking, 'This can't be real.'"

He noted that he and his Chambers, 321 West Third St., wife, Rebecca, were in shock, but didn't want to scare Brendan.

> "We got to Sioux Falls Sanford Children's Castle of Care Hospital in Sioux Falls where the doctors did more blood work and came back with the diagnosis of AML,' Marc said.

AML is acute myeloid leukemia. According to the American Cancer Society, acute leukemia usually develops quickly. The number of leukemia cells increases rapidly, and these abnormal cells don't do the work of normal white blood cells. A bone marrow test may show a high level of leukemia cells

and low levels of normal blood cells. People with acute leukemia may feel very tired, bruise easily and get infections frequently. AML affects myeloid cells and grows quickly. Leukemic blast cells collect in the bone marrow and blood.

About 15,000 Americans were diagnosed with AML in 2013. About 8,000 were 65 or older, and about 870 children and teens were diagnosed with the disease.

'We were told we needed to start treatment right away," Marc said. "He went to the clinic on Saturday, and on Tuesday he started his first round of chemotherapy. They told us his bone marrow was 60 percent full of cancer cells and that it was in his spinal fluid."

Marc said the doctors described the chemotherapy they were going to use as a very aggressive -"like shooting a bazooka at it."

The first round of chemotherapy would be every 12 hours for 10 days, at which point they would then again look at his counts.

"His numbers started coming back slowly," he said. "We actually got to take him home in mid-August. School had already started."

The family had two weeks of waiting to see where Brendan's numbers would be. It turned out a second round of chemotherapy was needed. It would be two times a day for eight days.

"We completed the second round about three weeks ago," Marc said. "His counts had come up enough that he was able to come

According to Rebecca, all went well and the family should know the results by the time he starts his third round of chemotherapy on Tuesday, with a fourth round planned later in the year.

"It is just so tough — very emotional," Marc said when describing what the last few months have been like for his family. "You go from having this normal, athletic, healthy son, to, 'Oh my God! He could die!'

Brendan has been handling it all very well, Marc noted.

"He is just such a strong kid," he said. "It is hard having to sit in the room and wait. He has always been so active, if there was a sport or activity, he was doing it — to now, just being so tired."

Marc said Brendan's bone marrow is rebounding and starting to produce its own white blood cells and platelets. And on the last test there were no leukemia cells present.

He noted that the results they get from Thursday's tests may rule out the need for a transplant.

'What is amazing is that our daughter Erica is a 100 percent match," Marc said. When we first went in to have the tests done to see if any of us would be a match, she said she wanted it to be her.'

One thing Marc says that his family has struggled with is, "Why Brendan?"

AML is a non-heredity cancer. At this point, doctors don't know what causes it. However, Marc said that it is a very curable, treatable form of cancer.

He also noted that he has learned a lot about the person he wants to be because of the battle Brendan is fight-

"I am so aware of what I am going to be doing for other people," he said. "Avon has to be the best community in the whole world. The overwhelming support and care has been so humbling.

When asked what can be done to help the family, Marc said to donate blood.

"I used to give blood all the time, and when we moved to Avon, I kind of quit," he said. "With everything that has gone on with Brendan, you realize how important it is."

"The state is really looking for what they call a multisector approach," he said. They want education, government and business at a minimum to be working together on this. It doesn't mean that everybody needs to ante up, but it means everybody has to be in the game."

Also discussed was how the nine-county area around Yankton has been losing people at a rate of around 900 per year.

Kramer said this loss of young people is unacceptable.

"I've been going to these rural communities and sitting in their local cafes and asking these 18-to-30-yearolds, 'What are you going to do after you graduate from high school (or are already in the workforce)?" Kramer said. "You'd be surprised. They're looking for careers and they're thinking Omaha, Sioux Falls, the Twin Cities and they don't know anything about the opportunities in this region, including Yankton," he said. "We're losing 900 people in this ninecounty area between the ages of 18 and 30 and we can't afford that anymore." He added the city needs

to be better at marketing it-"(Young people) commu-

nicate differently," he said. "How do you get in front of them? I don't know, but we better figure that out. YAPG is already funding close to \$100,000 working with RTEC (Regional Technical Education Center) and (the Yankton School District) setting up websites and additional resources. But we need our companies to come to the table if we're able to find solutions. They're spending a great deal of money trying to

recruit these people, and whatever they're doing isn't working. We're just asking them to use some of those resources to develop a program that will work.

Kramer said the addition of a two-year technical education program is needed.

'We're at a significant disadvantage not having one," he said. "Having a two-year institution that's focused to the jobs we're generating and pre-training those welders and machinists here with the same support a Mitchell company would get — is what we should be doing."
