Remove Hay Bales From Right Of Way

PIERRE — The South Dakota Department of Transportation reminds land owners, hay remaining in highway ditches after Oct. 1 is deemed illegal.

Any person wishing to claim ownership of illegal bales must obtain a permit from the South Dakota Department of Transportation. Those permits are issued on a first-come first-served basis and allow permit holders to take ownership of any illegal hay bale.

Permits are available at Department of Transportation area offices in the following communities: Aberdeen, Belle Fourche, Custer, Huron, Mitchell, Mobridge, Pierre, Rapid City, Sioux Falls, Watertown, Winner and Yankton. ter activities, conferences, state and national conventions and community service projects. All of these events help the students gain leadership skills, grow personally, and prepare them for career success.

While FFA is one of the main components of ag education, schools like Bon Homme, Menno and Hartington that employ ag instructors offer classes focused on agriculture.

"Ag education at Bon Homme consists of three essential and interrelated components," Misar said. "These three components include classroom instruction, FFA and the student's supervised agricultural experience project. These components work together to provide the student with personal, academic and hands-on experiences that prepare the student for career success."

Misar said administrators and the public tend to think ag education only prepares students to be farmers.

"Agricultural education helps young people develop a greater understanding and knowledge of production agriculture and the associated support industries," he said. "Too often, ag education is considered a coursework that simply prepares students for production agriculture. However, there are a number of career opportunities that exist in food safety, renewable energy, natural resources, environmental sciences, economics and many more. Ag education does not only focus on production, but (it also) actually touches on everything associated with agriculture, food, fiber and natural resources."

Ag education not only prepares students for possible careers in the agriculture

industry, but it also provides an understanding of the industry for those who are unfamiliar with it, Misar said.

"Ag education and FFA are important because they provide the student with hands-on opportunities to learn," Misar said. "Our workforce needs talented, driven and passionate people. It is imperative that people recognize the importance that agricultural education plays in helping prepare students for the workforce and in helping students develop useful life skills."
