For Yankton, Andi Sprakel went 2-3 with a triple, a RBI and a run scored. Lexie McCorkell



Doane Escapes Mount Marty 3-2

After taking the third set, the Mount Marty College volleyball team looked like it would be in position to score its first Great Plains Athletic Conference victory

Doane, though, had other ideas, hitting .288 for the final two sets after swinging a measly .097 in the first three to claim a 24-26, 25-23, 14-25, 25-18, 15-8 victory over the Lancers on Saturday at Laddie E. Cimpl

"What was working for us was our attacking," said Mount Marty head coach Candice Climer after the match. "And we just couldn't get it going late."

Megan Fletcher had 20 kills and 20 digs, and Shelbbi Mlynczak had 15 kills and 24 digs to lead Doane. Cassandra Choquette posted 13 kills and Breanna Fye had 12 kills for the Doane offense.

Also for Doane, Rachel Wieser had 29 assists,

Haley Norvell had 24 assists and Julie Els had 28 digs. For the Mount Marty net attack, Sierra Kloth had 18 kills and Allison Cross had 13 kills without an error to lead the offense. It was MMC's first 100-dig match since 2011 (104 vs. York) and the most since 126 against Dakota Wesleyan in 2008.

"I love having that feeling that I know the back row will get the ball," Dythse said. "Our front row was amazing as well.

In the opening set, Doane jumped out to an early 8-6 lead, but a 7-1 Lancer run gave MMC a 13-9 edge. The run coincided with a group of students showing

up and loudly cheering on the team.
"It helps," Climer said of having a strong crowd behind the team. "But we keep telling them that they have to come up with that energy themselves when

the crowd isn't there." $\ensuremath{\mathsf{MMC}}$ did bring the crowd into the match late in the first set. After Doane had pushed out to a 22-17 edge, MMC ran off three straight points, then fought off three straight set points in a 5-0 rut to take the

opening stanza. Doane responded to open the second set, jumping out to a 14-4 lead. MMC fought back to tie the set at 21, but the Tigers broke a 23-all tie with two straight points, the last finished by Fye, to tie the match.

MMC grabbed the momentum in the third set and didn't let go, jumping out to a 9-3 edge and pulling away after Doane had pulled to within three at 13-10.

We came out in the third set and played our game. We put it together," Climer said. But the Lancers could not close out the match. In the final two sets MMC did not string together more


than two consecutive points. "We had all this momentum, then something happened and we didn't push past it," Dythse said. "It's something we're still working on.
