USD XC Teams Move Into Regional Rankings

VERMILION — The South Dakota women's and men's cross country teams moved into ninth- and 12th-place, respectively, in the latest Midwest region ranking released by the U.S. Track and Field/Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCA) on Monday.

The women's ninth-place ranking is the highest in program history, while the men equal their 12th-place finish at the NCAA Midwest Regional a year ago.

After this week's rankings, the Coyote women move ahead of Illinois and Iowa of the Big Ten, Kansas and Kansas State of the Big 12, and Loyola and Wichita State of the Missouri Valley.

The Summit League is represented by two men's teams and one women's team. IUPUI is ranked ninth in the Great Lakes region to join the Coyotes on the men's side, while the South Dakota women are the only ranked Summit League team on the women's side.

The Oklahoma State men and Iowa State women have led the Midwest region for a year.

Twins Fire Manager Ron Gardenhire After 13 Seasons

MINNEAPOLIS (AP) — The Minnesota Twins fired manager Ron Gardenhire on Monday, saying it was time for a new voice after his 13-season tenure concluded with at least 92 losses in each of the last four years.

The move was made with one season left on Gardenhire's contract, ending the second-longest active tenure in the major leagues behind Mike Scioscia of the Angels. "The reason for this change, I think it's safe to say, the last couple years we have not won enough games," Twins general manager Terry Ryan said.
