aren't just talking about it, they're acting on it."
 Junior Taylor Nivala leads the team with eight goals, followed by junior Rebecca Sparkman (4) and three others with three.
 And in addition, sophomore forward Corey Strang was Monday named Summit League Offensive Player of the Week.
 Not bad for a team that doesn't spend a lot of time in practice on offensive finishes, Green said — she estimated 75 percent of practice time is spent on keeping possession.
 "It's mostly just them creating opportunities," she said. "We've given them a couple ideas how to finish better, but it's all them executing."
 Now it's just a matter of continuing the momentum into the Summit League season.
 The Coyotes were picked to finish last — ninth place — in the conference race, with only the top four teams advancing to the post-season tournament in Denver.
 "This year, more than any other year, we're the best equipped to do well in conference," Green said.
 "Not just with the personnel, but the confidence and belief that we can actually win this year."
 Sitting atop the league standings after non-conference action doesn't exactly mean the Coyotes are celebrating, according to Bennett.
 "What we've done so far really doesn't matter. Conference is what matters," she said. "This is a new season for us; this is what matters in the long run."
