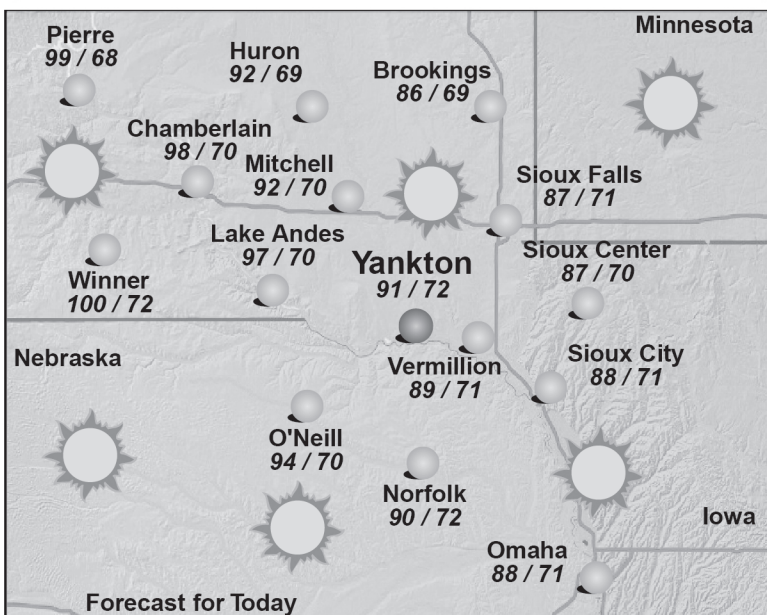

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were mostly lower Tuesday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for December delivery was up 1.25 cents to \$4.8625 a bushel; December corn fell 6.25 cents to 3.69 a bushel; December oats were off 6.25 cents to 2.24 a bushel; while November soybeans

lost 13.5 cents to \$8.74 a bushel. Beef fell while pork was mixed on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. October live cattle was off 1.88 cents to \$1.4132 a pound; October feeder cattle lost 2.55 cents to \$1.9532 a pound; while October lean hogs fell .05 cent to \$6.797 a pound.

Stocks plunged again Tuesday, continuing a rocky ride for Wall Street, after an economic report out of China rekindled fears that the world's second-largest economy is slowing more than previously anticipated.

The Dow fell 469.68 points, or 2.8 percent, to 16,058.35.
The Standard & Poor's 500 index dropped 58.33 points, or 3 percent, to 1,913.85.
The Nasdaq composite lost 140.40 points, or 2.9 percent, to 4,636.10.

FOR THE WEEK:

The Dow is down 584.66 points, or 3.5 percent.
The S&P 500 has lost 75.02 points, or 3.8 percent.
The Nasdaq is down 192.22 points, or 4 percent.

FOR THE YEAR:

The Dow is down 1,764.72 points, or 9.9 percent.
The S&P 500 index is down 145.05 points, or 7.1 percent.

KNOX CO. SHERIFF'S REPORT

- There is another phone scam making its way around again. The caller claims to be with the IRS. The person states that you owe money from different tax years and if you don't pay, they will have law enforcement arrest you. They may ask for your social security number, bank account information, credit card numbers, etc. One person called back the scammer and they even answered IRS. Never give out information to unknown people. If you owe money to the IRS, they will most likely send you a certified letter stating so.
