## Grindle Named PA Voice For NU FB

LINCOLN, Neb. (AP) — A months-old Facebook post has cost the Nebraska football stadium announcer his job one day after his hiring was announced.

Jon Schuetz said Tuesday that a university official told him he was let go because of a Facebook post critical of the firing of football coach Bo Pelini last November. Schuetz said he has deleted the post and declined to comment on what it said.

"They were correct to do it," Schuetz said of his firing. "I own it. It should be a lesson to everybody: be very careful what you say on social media."

The university has named Lane Grindle the Memorial Stadium announcer starting with Saturday's game against BYU. Grindle has worked as radio sideline reporter for the Husker IMG Sports Network.

Grindle became the third man in a month to hold the job. The school on Aug. 6 fired its longtime public address announcer, Patrick Combs, after he was arrested on suspicion of bilking hundreds of thousands of dollars from two elderly women.
