— I don't like this country-city (rivalry). I'd like us all to collaborate and all move ahead so everybody is cooperating and doing well."

He added that they also emphasize transparency. "One of our goals when we started is to have transparency so you can see what we're doing and what we're thinking about, and we decided we'd have town hall meetings at least once per year, and this is the first one we've had," he said.

The town hall followed a general discussion format and took up just more than an hour.

The main topic of discussion centered around the county's decision to impose a property tax levy to help raise revenues for road and bridge repairs. Residents expressed concerns about other entities taking too much money that they believe could be used for road projects.

Other topics of discussion included storm sirens set to be added in the Lewis & Clark Lake area, the Napa Junction project and general development in the county. Kettering told the Press &

Dakotan that he was happy to see the night's turnout.

"It was a good meeting," he said. "There was a lot of back-and-forth discussion of very important issues that people are impressed with."

Freng told the Press & Dakotan said it was a good learning experience for the commission.

"I was happy with the turnout and I wish we would've done this sooner," she said. "We've learned the Mayfield area up here feels a little neglected by the county and that we should try harder to connect with some of our rural communities."

She added that the area's residents understand the need for road improvements but have some concerns.

"I think they also expressed understanding that the roads are very important," she said. "The rural roads out here are a major artery for farmers to get their grain to market and they understand that, but they're a little concerned about the taxes and they just need their questions answered. We just have to keep the communication flowing."

The next town hall is set for 6 p.m. today (Thursday) at Cottonwood Corral west of Yankton.

## Russia Delays New Body To Assign Blame For Syrian Attacks

UNITED NATIONS — Russia is holding up Security Council approval to establish a new international body to assign blame for chemical attacks in Syria's deadly conflict for the first time.

Russia's U.N. Ambassador Vitaly Churkin, who holds the council presidency in September, told reporters Wednesday that Russia had questions about the proposal by U.N. Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon.

He also raised the possibility that the council might need a new resolution to deal with allegations that the Islamic State extremist group has used chemical weapons including mustard gas in neighboring Iraq.

The Syrian government denies using chemical weapons but the United States and other Western nations contend Syria's government is to blame, especially for barrel bombs containing chlorine and other toxic agents dropped by helicopters, since the opposition doesn't have aircraft.

Ban sent a letter to the council last Thursday recommending the establishment of a three-member independent panel backed by experts with the freedom to go anywhere in Syria to identify those responsible for using chlorine and other chemical weapons so perpetrators can be brought to justice. The council was supposed to respond in five days.

Churkin said Russia wants the clarifications it was given by the U.N. Secretariat to its concerns to be put in writing "so that everybody has the same kind of understanding of what is going to happen in

the work" of the so-called Joint Implementation Mechanism.

He said one example was Ban's call for voluntary contributions to fund the new body and Russia's concern that contributions could influence the "impartiality" of the new body. He said "some good explanations were given about how the money is going to be spent."

Last month, the council unanimously approved a resolution giving a green light to establish an international investigative body to determine responsibility for chemical attacks that have killed and injured a growing number of civilians over the past two years — and to go to suspect sites in government and opposition controlled areas. But council members also need to sign off on Ban's plan for the new body.

Reports have also surfaced in recent months that the Islamic State extremist group, which controls a third of Syria and Iraq, has used toxic chemicals. Churkin said Russia knows that the group has been "actively working" in this direction, including "using the services of some foreign experts to try to produce chemicals which can be used as a weapon."

He said Russia is very concerned about reports that Islamic State militants may be using toxic chemicals in both countries, and has been discussing the reports with the Iraqi government which is taking them seriously and "looking into it themselves."

In the case of Syria "the Security Council has played an important role in dealing with this problem," Churkin said, but in the case of Iraq Russia believes the council may need to adopt a new resolution at some point.

Pine streets. That area was cordoned off and Third St. was barricaded Tuesday night during the investigation.

DCI agents arrived on the scene at about 11 p.m. Tuesday night. Also on the scene were Yankton police, Yankton County sheriff's deputies and the South Dakota Highway Patrol.

Sara Rabern, public information officer for the South Dakota State Attorney General's office, told the Press & Dakotan that no further information is available as long as Angel is still in the hospital.

She said she is unable to comment on Angel's condition, but did say that Sgt. Foote is on administrative leave at this

time.

Rabern said DCI gets involved in cases that involve the use of force, and that it could be some time before the full details of the incident are available.

"DCI's called in when an officer uses lethal force or deadly force," she said. "DCI does the investigation and we write a summary report within 30 days of the incident. ... We wait on toxicology reports, we do criminal history."

She added that interviews and reviews of any possible footage of the incident will also be reviewed.

Angel was also arrested Sunday in Yankton for purchase, possession or consumption of alcohol by a minor, intentional damage to property (\$400-\$1,000), second-degree vandalism and grand theft of a motor vehicle more than \$1,000.

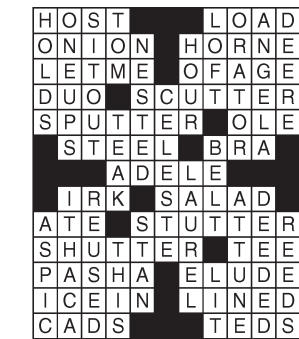

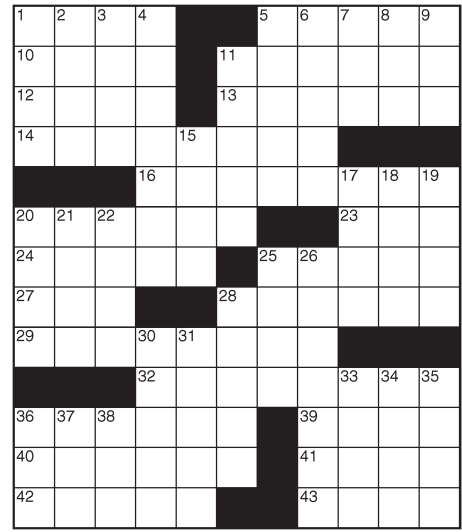
