time. Rabern said DCI gets involved in cases that involve the use of force, and that it could be some time before the full details of the incident are

available. "DCI's called in when an officer uses lethal force or deadly force," she said. "DCI does the investigation and we write a summary report within 30 days of the incident. ... We wait on toxicology reports, we do criminal history.

She added that interviews and reviews of any possible footage of the incident will also be reviewed.
