BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were mostly higher Thursday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for December delivery rose 2.5 cents to \$4.6775 a bushel; December corn was up 1.5 cents to 3.63 a bushel; December oats were up .50 cent to 2.2325 a bushel; while November soybeans de-

clined 3 cents to \$8.6650 a bushel.

Beef and pork were lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. October live cattle was off 1.13 cents to \$140.47 a pound; October feeder cattle lost 1.62 cents to \$195.70 a pound; while October lean hogs shed .30 cent to \$6.915 a pound.

WALL ST. RECAP

U.S. stocks slumped on Friday after the government's monthly jobs report gave investors few clues about the Federal Reserve's next move on interest rates. The government reported that the unemployment rate fell to a seven-year low in August, but also said that employers added fewer jobs than forecast.

The Standard & Poor's 500 index declined 29.91 points, or 1.5 percent, to 1,921.22.

The Nasdaq composite dropped 49.58 points, or 1.1 percent, to 4,683.92.

The Dow is down 540.63 points, or 3.3 percent.

DPS: Use Careful Driving This Labor Day Weekend

PIERRE — South Dakota's Department of Public Safety officials hope for another fatality-free Labor Day travel weekend this year.

There were no fatality crashes reported in 2014. That was the first year since 2004 that no highway fatality was reported during the Labor Day holiday period. There were 35 injury crashes and 42 injuries reported during the 2014 holiday weekend.

"We still had too many crashes, but thankfully no fatalities," says Lee Axsdahl, director of the state Office of Highway Safety. "Our goal again this year is no fatalities. If every driver makes safe, smart choices, families and friends can celebrate the final holiday of the summer without any grief."

Col. Craig Price, superintendent of the Highway Patrol, says troopers will have a visible presence on the state's highways and roads during the holiday weekend. He says the

holiday is a busy travel one with many motorists attending the South Dakota State Fair and other events.

"Safe travel is everyone's responsibility every day, but it is even more important during a busy time like the Labor Day weekend," Price says. "Your chances of traveling safely are greatly improved if you follow speed limits, drive defensively in the higher volume of holiday traffic and buckle up."

Among the safety tips the department recommends:

- Do not drink and drive.
- Make sure that everybody in the vehicle is wearing a seat belt.
- Observe all rules of the road.
- Don't become distracted while driving.
- Watch out for other motorists and wildlife.

Both the Office of Highway Safety and the Highway Patrol are part of the Department of Public Safety.
