






# Daugaard Declares Sept. 7-13 Suicide Prevention Week

PIERRE — Gov. Dennis Daugaard has proclaimed Sept. 7-13 as Suicide Prevention Week in South Dakota. Suicide occurs across all age, economic, social and ethnic boundaries, and is now the tenth leading cause of all deaths in the United States and the ninth leading cause of all deaths in the state of South Dakota. "The goal is to reduce the stigma associated with mental illness and encourage those who have mental health concerns to seek help," said Gib Sudbeck, program manager, for the Department of Social

Services' Prevention Program. "Suicide is a preventable cause of premature death and needs to be addressed." Suicides may be prevented when suicidal behaviors are detected early and individuals are referred to services and supports. Help can be obtained in South Dakota communities for the assessment and treatment of suicidal behaviors and their underlying causes. If you believe there is a suicide risk, contact a professional immediately. Call the suicide crisis hotline at 1-800-273-TALK (8255), a family

physician, a psychiatrist, a medical emergency room or a community mental health center in your area. VERMILLION — The Nikki's Fund 5K Run/Walk to help University of South Dakota students in crisis situations and also promote suicide prevention awareness throughout the region will be Saturday, Sept. 12, as part of National Suicide Prevention Week. "Over the years, Nikki's Fund and the Nikki's Fund 5K have provided great support

to USD students struggling with mental health-related concerns, including suicidal thoughts and intent," said Debra Brockberg, director of the USD Student Counseling Center. "The funds have provided financial support to students in need of medical assistance, lab work, funding for medication and diagnostic testing for mental health concerns, as well as travel costs to and from appointments." The 2015 race/walk starts at 9 a.m., Saturday, Sept. 12, at Prentiss Park, which is also the finish line, with runners and walkers navigating a street course through downtown Vermillion. Prizes are awarded

to first place finishers in the male and female categories of 15 and under, 16 to 25 years old, 26 to 54 years old and 55 and over. T-shirts and refreshments will also be provided. Registration forms are available at the Student Counseling Center, which is located at the Cook House on the USD campus. Participants can also register online at AllSport-Central or complete a form the day of the run at 8 a.m. at Prentiss Park.
