Parkston Duo Named To South Dakota Team For USGA Event

Three teenagers are representing South Dakota in the USGA Women's State Team Championship which begins Thursday at Dalhousie Golf Club in Cape Girardeau, Mo. Sydney Bormann of Parkston, McKayla Poppens of Lennox and Sydney Weber of Parkston earned their spot on the South Dakota team by virtue of performances the past two years in the Women's Match Play, Women's Amateur and Two-Women championships. All three are seniors in high school — Bormann and Weber at Parkston High School and Poppens at Sioux Falls Roosevelt.

The South Dakota team is one of five teams comprised of all teenagers. Though there is no age limit for this Championship, golfers currently on a college teams are ineligible to compete, per NCAA rules.

The team score is determined by the two low scorers each day. The second round of competition is Friday, with the low 21 teams and ties advancing to Saturday's final round. A total of 50 teams are competing.

Sioux Falls native Shannon Johnson, who now resides in Foxborough, Mass., is playing on the Massachusetts team in the competition. Johnson, a winner of 13 SDGA championships, won the Massachusetts Women's Amateur Championship this summer.
