SIoux FALLS – In some ways, Arlin Likness was going through a typical Wednesday afternoon. He spoke about his Yankton High School football team in front of a large crowd, which had just finished lunch.

The only differences were, this was 70 miles away in Sioux Falls and Likness was talking about a game in the Presidents Bowl. It was new territory for Likness, the long-time Yankton coach. Not since 1995 has someone other than a Sioux Falls school played in the Presidents Bowl, the 24th annual event that typically features O’Gorman, Lincoln, Roosevelt and Washington.

A quirk in the schedule (O’Gorman has a road game at Brandon

Valley), however, meant Yankton – with its regularly-scheduled game against Washington – would join the fun. But for one time. “It just happens to be the right time,” Likness said later, after his speech at the Presidents Bowl media luncheon in Sioux Falls. “Timing is everything.” And he’s right. Because the Bucks (2-0) are coming off a championship season and are ranked No. 1 coming into the Presidents Bowl, there’s undoubtedly a different allure to them being part of the fray. But for the Bucks themselves, they have prepared this week just as they would for, say, Huron. They haven’t changed their routine based on when or where they play, it just meant extra obligations for people like Likness and activities director Ryan Mors – who was also in Sioux Falls on Wednesday.

And while playing in such a game is a change for the Bucks, it’s also a change for those three other Sioux Falls schools. “I think it’s great, just to have some change,” Washington coach Chad Stadem said. “Change is always good.” So too is the challenge for Yankton. With the Sioux Falls schools now in a different classification, teams like Yankton in the 11AA division no longer have to concern themselves with the ‘big boys’ come playoff time. But when there’s the regular season scenario like Yankton faces Saturday, it gives the Bucks a measuring stick. “It’s a great test, as far as a confidence-booster and so forth,” Likness said. “Hopefully we come out and get some things done.”

## Too Many Stats? CBS Broadcasters Say They Won't Go Overboard

NEW YORK (AP) — For those NFL fans whose heads are swimming as all kinds of numbers are bandied about, fear not when watching CBS telecasts this season.

Unless the statistics and analytics improve the broadcast, viewers won't be inundated by them, the CBS announcers promise.

“You take it and integrate it into our own brand of storytelling,” says Solomon Wilcotts, who will work games with play-by-play man Spero Dedes. “There is a place for it, but it always has to humanize our stories. We will use the

numbers to quantify the impact a player has on a game, to distinguish him and his contributions.

“But it has to be a support, not the basis or the foundation for our story. The numbers can be an add-on, can complement the storytelling. It's necessary to find a balance, otherwise the numbers fall flat. How does the data translate to making for a better player. Connect the dots.”

Wilcotts, a former defensive back with particular expertise in matchups between receivers and the guys covering them, points to Lions star Cal-

vin Johnson. Wilcotts believes analytics and Next Gen Stats, particularly those using digital chips in players' pads, can be very enlightening in evaluating Johnson's advantages against opponents.

“The data is able to show exactly that — where he's most impactful, where he has the biggest edge on a defender. Where Matthew Stafford throws the ball to Calvin; does he know from this data that he can just throw the ball to a certain place and Calvin is going to get it?”

“Has there ever been a player like this, who can do

what he does? The chip in the pads shows us this data; there was never a chip on Randy Moss to show us, so we don't know if he could do the same things Calvin can do. So we now have that data and we can compare Calvin to the next player.”

Less beneficial is a stream of numbers that obscures or misleads. As 2002 MVP Rich Gannon, the analyst for play-by-play announcer Kevin Harlan, points out, there can be extenuating circumstances that result in certain statistics and rankings.
