




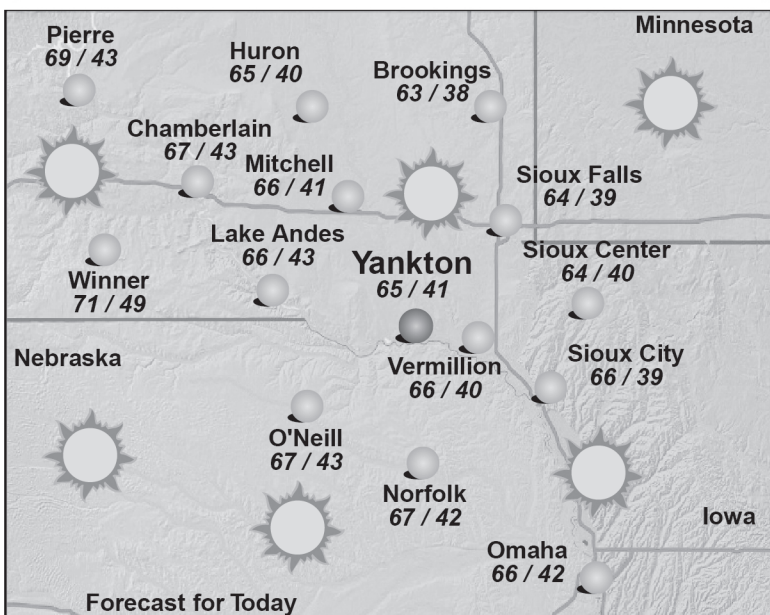

CDC And Commerce Officials And Sioux Falls Lawyer Among USD Lecture Series Speakers

VERMILLION — The fall lecture series hosted by the University of South Dakota's College of Arts & Sciences will feature speakers from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Department of Commerce, the Sioux Falls banking industry, a businessman and a history professor.

The four Farber Forums and the 64th Annual Harrington Lecture will take place in Old Main's Farber Hall over the next few months. Hosting speakers from within the university and beyond, all five lectures are free and open to the public. Each Farber Series lecture begins at 4 p.m. on its respective date, and the Harrington Lecture begins at 7 p.m.

The Farber speakers:

- Christine Cagle, the CDC's associate director for policy, planning and communications in the division for HIV/AIDS prevention, will present "The New Era of HIV Prevention in a Dynamic Health Care Field" on Sept. 16.

- Douglas J. Hajek, a 1985 USD School of Law graduate, will deliver "When Citibank Came to South Dakota: The economics, personalities and

politics behind the move" on Sept. 22. The banking lawyer is currently partnered with the Davenport Evans firm in Sioux Falls.

- Stephen B. Hall will lecture Oct. 8 on "International Job Opportunities: 10 Secrets of Getting that Overseas Job." Before his employment with the Bureau of Industry and Security in the U.S. Department of Commerce, Hall attended both Vermillion High School and USD (1974).

- Fred Winkler will present "Are College Students Still Designed for Slow in a World Gone Fast?" on Oct. 21. The 1966 USD School of Law graduate is president and CEO of Dakota Investments and COO for CitiGroup (formerly AT&T) Universal Card Services.

- Finally, on Oct. 28, USD history professor Clayton Lehmann will deliver the 64th Annual Harrington Lecture. He received his doctorate degree in history from the University of Chicago and plans to speak on "Imagining Greece." Much of his teaching and research have focused on Greek and Roman history, archaeology and epigraphy.

- Workmen are pressing to complete the new Yankton college residence complex, McMurtry, Larabee and Evans Halls, as the campus begins to fill rapidly prior to the beginning of registration and enrollment on Tuesday.

25 YEARS AGO

Tuesday, September 11, 1990

- Help will be available for some overcrowded classrooms in the Yankton School District, the Yankton School Board learned at its Monday meeting. Superintendent Joe Gertsema told the board that a teacher aide would be hired for the sixth grade at Beadle School.

September is Mental Health And Substance Use Recovery Month

PIERRE — Gov. Dennis Daugaard has proclaimed September as Recovery Month in South Dakota, calling upon all South Dakotans to recognize individuals in recovery and their families, and saluting the health care providers who have helped these individuals in their pursuit of recovery.

"It is critical that people experiencing mental and/or substance use disorders receive the support they need," said Tiffany Wolfgang Division Director for Behavioral Health. "Prevention works and recovery is possible with access to behavioral health services and supports."

This past year in South Dakota, 25,054 individuals received assistance through publicly funded behavioral health providers for mental health and/or addictions

services. If an individual is interested in seeking recovery from alcoholism, drug, gambling addiction, or is seeking mental health services, there are 64 accredited providers across South Dakota with programs and services available. BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were mostly higher Thursday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for December delivery rose 5.75 cents to \$4.78 a bushel; December corn was up 5.25 cents to 3.7425 a bushel; December oats were off 1.25 cents to 2.32 a bushel; while November soybeans gained

1.75 cents to \$8.74 a bushel. Beef was lower and pork was unchanged on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. December live cattle was off .37 cent to \$1.4470 a pound; October feeder cattle fell .07 cent to \$1.9850 a pound; while December lean hogs was unchanged to \$.6355 a pound.

WALL ST. RECAP

U.S. stocks bucked a global market slump Thursday as investors look ahead to a crucial Federal Reserve meeting next week on interest rates. Investors pushed major indexes lower in the morning following drops in Asia and Europe, then reversed course and turned higher. Nine of the 10 sectors of the S&P 500 index rose, led by technology companies.

FOR THE DAY:

The Dow rose 76.83 points, or 0.5 percent, to 16,330.40. The Standard & Poor's 500 index rose 10.25 points, or 0.5 percent, to 1,952.29. The Nasdaq composite climbed

39.72 points, or 0.8 percent, to 4,796.25.

FOR THE WEEK:

The Dow is up 228.02 points, or 1.4 percent.

The S&P 500 index is up 31.07 points, or 1.6 percent.

The Nasdaq is up 112.33 points, or 2.4 percent.

FOR THE YEAR:

The Dow is down 1,492.67 points, or 8.4 percent.

The S&P 500 index is down 106.61 points, or 5.2 percent.

The Nasdaq is up 60.20 points, or 1.3 percent.
