Washington (332) and Aberdeen Central (333). Second at the Class AA state tournament a year ago, O'Gorman put four of its golfers in the top five Friday. Jacob Otta was the individual champion at 74, one better than teammate Justin Kolb, and for good measure, Tony Hayes tied for third (76) and Bryce Hammer tied for fifth (77). "We've got depth, and that's a big deal," head coach Tom Jansa said. "All our guys know there are five other guys who can contribute for us." But for Otta in particular, he came back from the 2014 season motivated to improve his personal game and his team's performance, according to his coach. "He's a pretty fiery competitor," Jansa said. "He, like many of our guys, came back this year not satisfied with how they finished last year." Yankton, conversely, isn't quite worried yet about the state tournament, the youthful Bucks — just three seniors on the roster — are instead looking at incremental progress. To that end, freshman Michael Frick led the way Friday. He carded a 79 to not only lead the Bucks, but finish in a tie for 10th place. "It was a pretty good day," Frick said. "My putting really saved me today." Considering Hillcrest was playing a little long Friday, Frick's performance was all the more notable, Sime said. "To be in the top ten in a real tough field is really impressive," Sime said. "That should give him a lot of confidence and drive, moving forward. It's a great testament to how hard he works."
