Washington quarterback Jack Schelhaas completed 11-of-17 passes for 201 yards and four touchdowns, and also had a pair of touchdown runs. The third-year starter consistently tested the Yankton cornerbacks and safeties, and more than a handful of times, Washington receivers simply out-jumped defenders for the ball. “Defensively, we struggled in the secondary,” Gant said. “They pounded the ball at us.” Ty Smith, who stands 6-foot-4, caught a pair of touchdowns, while Logan Eckhoff and Logan Uttecht also hauled in touchdowns from Schelhaas. A week after the Yankton defense held Mitchell standout quarterback Kanin Nelson in check, the Bucks struggled in that department. “We found out that our secondary needs to get better,” Likness said. “We gave up some big vertical plays, and you can’t have that many and expect to win.” Down 22-0 in the second quarter, Yankton finally got its offense going. A 10-play drive, highlighted by a 41-yard Gant run on a fake punt, was capped off by a Gant 7-yard touchdown run. The Bucks had some short-lived momentum right after halftime, when they forced a Washington punt, scored on a Tanner Frick 7-yard touchdown run, and forced another punt. Yankton’s defense then pushed the Warriors all the way back to the Washington 8-yard line, but on a 3rd & 7, Schelhaas hit Michael Enalls on the left sideline for 30 yards — he out-jumped a cornerback.
