SIOUX FALLS — Before the Yankton football team ever really got going, it found itself down by

And by the time the dust settled Saturday, Sioux Falls Washington had claimed a 43-19 victory over the Bucks at the Presidents Bowl in

The top-ranked Bucks — the newcomer to the annual all-Sioux Falls event — threw an interception on the game's first drive, then surrendered a touchdown, fumbled the ensuing kickoff and then

gave up a 54-yard touchdown on a 3rd & 41.

It was that kind of afternoon for Yankton (2-1) but in the end, wasn't necessarily a loss that will hurt the Bucks in the Class 11AA scheme.

"This is a great learning game for us," senior Sheldon Gant said. "As much as I hate losing, if there was one, this would be it."

Two plays in particular told the story. The first was that 3rd & 41 conversion by the Class 11AAA Warriors (2-1), and the second was on a 30-yard completion when Washington was backed up to its own 8-yard line late in the third

Ninety-five yards later, the Warriors were in the end zone, and any chances Yankton had of a rally were quickly dashed.

What was one of the big differences? 'Our attitude of the game," Yankton coach Arlin Likness said. "We didn't clean up the little things, like the interception and a fumble.

And against a good team, you can't do things Particularly when the Warriors boasted a dual-

threat quarterback and an explosive offense.

USD Downs UC Davis For First Victory

DAVIS, Calif. (AP) — Trevor Bouma rushed for a careerhigh 186 yards and two touchdowns to lead the Coyotes to a 27-17 win over UC Davis on Saturday.

The win by the Coyotes was their first outdoor win on the road since beating Minnesota in 2010. They were beaten 34-0 by Kansas Štate in last week's season-opener.

Bouma led a ground game for USD (1-1) that churned out 240 yards, while the Coyotes defense held the Aggies to just 60 vards.

Bouma scored on runs of 10 and 63 yards as USD beat the Aggies (0-2) for the third time in four years. His long run changed momentum after UC Davis had scored the previous two touchdowns to cut its deficit to 20-17.

"They took turns doing things they needed to do. The defense would rise up then the offense would make a play," USD coach Joe Glenn said. "Then Trevor Bouma put a nail in them. Boy, what a run that was.'

USD's defense sacked UC Davis quarterback Ben Scott five times for 41 yards. Scott had most of the Aggies' offense, completing 21 of 39 passes for 240 yards. He was picked off three times and UC Davis also lost a fumble.

Aggies receiver Chris Martin caught five passes for 127 yards and a score.

USD quarterback Ryan Saeger was efficient. He completed 12 of 22 passes for 137

Bouma was also USD's leading receiver with three catches for 48 yards.
