

DSU Spoils Home Opener For MMC

Tuesday night's game marked the first home game for new Mount Marty College head coach Frank Hebenstriet. The outcome may not have been what Hebenstriet and his Lancers were hoping for, but the Lancer coach did see some positives.

The Dakota State Trojans defeated the Lancers 25-20, 18-25, 28-26, 25-18 in an inner-state rivalry at Laddie E. Cimpl Arena.

"At times we played very well, and at other times we struggled," said Hebenstriet. "Overall, we just made too many attacking errors to win.'

With the Trojans winning the match's opening set, Dakota State and Mount Marty were locked at 16 points each midway through the second set. The Lancers then responded with a 9-2 run to even the score at one set victory apiece.

"We were really playing well at that point," said Hebenstriet. "That even gave us momentum heading into set three.'

After trailing by as many as seven points in the third set, Dakota State rallied to complete a 28-26 come-from-behind victory.
"We battled hard in the third," said Heben-

striet. "As athletes, you cannot let losing a set like that affect the way you play, and I hope that was not the case.'

The Trojans used momentum to carry them to a 25-18 fourth game victory, winning the match in four sets.

Dakota State was led by Tessa Welldreyer, who totaled 14 kills. Carly Rozell also added 13

Even though the Lancers did not come out on top, Tuesday's game did have a bright spot for Mount Marty. In the match, the Lancers 2014 leader in attacking percentage, Allison Cross, made her season debut.

Cross saw limited action as she was just cleared to play Tuesday afternoon.

"Having Allison on the court was great not only for our team but for her," said Hebenstriet.
"She has been a huge part of this program, and it was nice to see her back on the court.

With the loss Mount Marty falls to 4-5 on the season and will travel to Dordt College on Wednesday night. Dakota State improves to 7-9 and will have a road game with Mayville State on

"When we played well tonight we were communicating and playing as a team," said Hebenstriet. "We need to use that teamwork in the future to be successful."
