Sanford Pentagon Adds SDSU-Middle Tennessee Game

SIoux FALLS – A fourth NCAA Division I men's college basketball game is coming to the Sanford Pentagon this season.

November and December at the Pentagon include a quartet of Division I men's basketball games on Heritage Court.

Middle Tennessee has defeated South Dakota State twice since the two teams first met during the 2005-06 season.

South Dakota State (24-11 overall, 12-4 Summit League in 2014-15) is coming off an appearance in the National Invitation Tournament that saw the Jackrabbits bounce top-seeded Colorado State.

Middle Tennessee (19-17 overall, 9-9 CUSA in 2014-15) made it to the finals of the Conference USA Championship last season, falling to UAB in the title game.

DWU's Randi (Morgan) Haines Inducted Into NAIA Hall

MITCHELL – One name is more synonymous with Dakota Wesleyan University women's basketball than any other and now that name is enshrined in the NAIA Hall of Fame.

Haines was joined in the 2015 class by Oklahoma City University men's golfer Tyrone Van Aswegen, Olivet Nazarene University men's track and field star Mark Hollis and Bethel College men's basketball player Rico Swanson.

Haines holds numerous records at DWU, including most points scored. She racked up 2,557 points in her career.

Haines was named an NAIA All-American three times, twice on the first team and once on the third team.

Haines was the cornerstone of the 2001-02 DWU team that went 32-6 overall, including wins over the University of South Dakota, Augustana College and Northern State University.

Haines now resides in Brandon, with her husband Wyatt and her three sons, Walker, 5, Walely, 3, and Wheeler, 1.
