The tournament will begin with tonight's games at 8 p.m. On Friday, there will be an afternoon session at 1 p.m., with three different sets of games that night starting at 7 p.m.

The main tournament will consist of games all day Saturday beginning at 8:30 a.m. followed by an awards banquet at 6:15 p.m. and another set of games that night.

There will be at least 90 annual awards given at Saturday's banquet including: the top 10 players of the year (All American Team), top volunteers of the year all across the ACC, president's award, rookie of the year award, grassroots club national award and Internet cribbage top players.

Sunday will be the playoffs where the top 25 percent of the players in Saturday's main tournament will compete for cash prizes. The remaining 75 percent will still have the opportunity to compete in the consolation tournament Sunday.

"If someone were to play in all of the events, not counting the playoffs, it could be at least 71 games of cribbage from Thursday night to Sunday," Kooistra said. "If they make it to the playoffs, that will be even more."

At least 20 people from the Yankton area will be playing in these events, including ten in the main tournament, he said. Yankton's Cribbage Club recently began its season Monday; the club meets the second and fourth Mondays in September through May.

The club currently has 38 national ACC members and at least 50 people who have tried

track west from Mitchell known as the MRC line.

Regular service is back in place on the MRC line as far as Chamberlain, with a new grain elevator and fertilizer complex near Kimball where Yeaton now is the manager.

Another major rehabilitation project is under way on the MRC line from Chamberlain to Presho, including the Missouri River bridge. Wheat Growers is constructing a large elevator and fertilizer complex at Kennebec along that segment.

Two of the state board members didn't participate in the vote Wednesday. Carl Anderson of Aberdeen, who was participating by telephone, abstained because he wasn't able to be on the call during one of the presentations. Yeaton as chairman chose to abstain too.

The selection of Dakota Southern to become leaseholder on the Napa-Platte line ends a relationship of more than 30 years between the state board and the Napa-Platte regional railroad authority.

Dakota Southern has held the sublease from the regional authority, but the authority's leadership soured on Dakota Southern in recent years.

The regional authority opposed Dakota Southern's proposal Wednesday and lost in the competition.

The authority submitted a proposal and also supported a separate proposal from Ralph Marquardt of Yankton.

Marquardt, a member of the state Transportation Commission, runs a trucking business based in Yankton and Sioux Falls and has a grain elevator at Tabor along

the Napa-Platte line. Mike Williams of Dakota Southern told the state board he has been in recent talks with Marquardt about getting service to Marquardt's elevator over the existing track.

Williams said he's recently surveyed much of the line and believes he can have track to Tabor open in 30 days.

Williams' proposal calls for the state board to receive 1.5 percent of the Napa-Platte track income. Marquardt offered an average of 2 percent for a five-year lease.

Dakota Plains manager Matt Winsand made clear to the state board Wednesday he preferred that Marquardt's business wouldn't be serving Dakota Plains' new center.

Burlington Northern Santa Fe meanwhile didn't submit a proposal to run on the Napa-Platte line.

Instead, Winsand said, BNSF wants switches on its line north and south of the junction, and requests a switch on the Napa-Platte line, so changing directions will be easier.

Known among railroaders as the Napa wye, the junction is where the state-owned line from the west connects with a major line for Burlington Northern Santa Fe.

Under a previous agreement, Burlington Northern Santa Fe must allow traffic from the Napa-Platte line to travel over its line. That permits Napa-Platte traffic to reach a variety of other railroads.

The new lease for Dakota Southern should contain performance measures, state board member Harlan Quenzer of Mitchell said. Other board members agreed.

Those will be developed as part of the contract

that state Transportation Secretary Darin Bergquist and members of his staff will negotiate in the coming weeks.

The final contract would need a vote of approval from the state board.

Board member Jerry Cope of Rapid City cast the lone vote against changing to Dakota Southern.

Cope said Marquardt had offered to the state board a larger percentage of income.

Cope also questioned why the state board should end its arrangement with the regional authority.

The regional authorities were created in state law decades ago and given power to levy property taxes if railroads didn't repay state loans.

Ken Cotton, a lawyer for the regional authority, said the state board would lose some protection by dealing directly with Dakota Southern on the lease. He said "it spits in the eye" of local people who kept the Napa-Platte authority running since 1981.

Williams said the plan for Dakota Southern would be to operate the line between Napa and Tabor, use the line between Tabor and Tyndall for storage of other companies' rail cars and take out the old line from Ravinia to Platte.

State board member Gary Doering of Cavour said none of the developments proposed in the past for the Napa-Platte line came to fruition.

Doering said that as a businessperson he would change his mind about proceeding with a project if a competitor gained control over rail service to his business.

That would have been the case if the state board gave the lease to Marquardt rather than Dakota Southern.

**Trade Mission Led By Nebraska Governor Ricketts Turns To China**

LINCOLN, Neb. (AP) — Gov. Pete Ricketts is headed to China for the next leg of his trade mission to meet with business and government leaders.

Ricketts began the trip in Japan, where he met with company officials who have opened production facilities in Nebraska.

The governor said Wednesday that he has met with Itochu, Japan's second-largest trading company; Kewpie, a food product

company with facilities in Norfolk, David City and Ravenna; and Kawasaki, which employs more than 2,000 people in Lincoln.

Ricketts says many of the talks have focused on vocational training. In China, Ricketts says he plans to talk about the center pivot industry.

Jack Schreiner, the president of the Hastings-based Bruckman Rubber Co., says the trip has helped his mid-sized business gain a foothold in international markets.

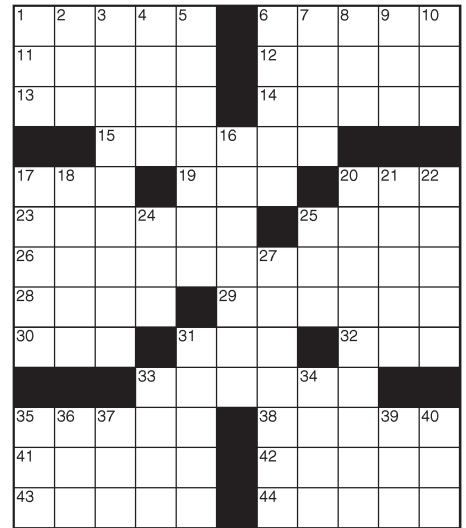
