State Rules Review Committee To Meet

PIERRE — The interim Rules Review Committee, chaired by Senator Mike Vehle (R-Mitchell), will meet on Monday, Sept. 21, at 10 a.m. (CT) in Room 414 of the State Capitol in Pierre.

The committee will review the rules proposed by the Department of Environment and Natural Resources; Board of Minerals and Environment; Department of Health: Division of Health Systems Development and Regulation; Department of Labor and Regulation; Division of Banking; S.D. Public Deposit Protection Commission, Division of Insurance, and Division of Securities; Department of Transportation; and Governor's Office of Economic Development; Board of Economic Development. Copies of the proposed rules may be obtained without charge by contacting the department, board or commission or at <https://rules.sd.gov/default.aspx>.

P.E.O. STAR Scholarship Offered

P.E.O., an international philanthropic organization that celebrates and supports the advancement of women through scholarships, grants, awards, loans and the stewardship of Cottey College in Nevada, Missouri, is offering P.E.O. STAR Scholarships to exceptional high school senior women who will attend an accredited post-secondary educational institution in the United States or Canada in the 2016-17 academic year.

Almost \$4.5 million has been awarded to 1,774 recipients of the STAR Scholarship since it was begun in 2009.

Four Yankton High School seniors have been awarded the \$2,500 scholarships since 2011.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were lower Thursday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for December delivery declined 6.75 cents to \$4.8150 a bushel; December corn was off 6.25 cents to 3.7975 a bushel; December oats were fell 2 cents to 2.3175 a bushel; while November soybeans lost 2.75 cents to \$8.8450 a bushel. Beef lower and pork was higher on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. December live cattle was off .15 cent to \$1.3932 a pound; October feeder cattle fell .65 cent to \$1.8780 a pound; while December lean hogs rose 2.28 cents to \$6.435 a pound.

Tuesday, September 18, 1990
• During a stop in Yankton Monday, Republican U.S. House candidate Don Frankenfeld said he wants to see the 1990 Farm Bill passed through Congress. Frankenfeld explained that congressmen have been on Agriculture Secretary Clayton Yeutter to mandate.
• The Downtown Yankton (Main Street) promotions committee is considering whether it wants to keep the Main Street Program and voluntarily fund a part-time manager.

Stocks ended mostly lower after a volatile day as traders tried to figure out what was next for U.S. interest rates. The bumpy trading came after the Federal Reserve decided to keep interest rates low for now, citing weakness in the global economy and unsettled financial markets.
