



SDSU will be the second Missouri Valley Football Conference opponent for Kobert Morris in a three-week span. The Colonials lost to Youngstown State 21-14 in overtime on Sept. 12.

■ SDSU scored 48 unanswered points in a 55-10 victory over Southern Utah on Sept. 12.

With only 16 career games in the books, SDSU sophomore receiver Jake Wieneke alraedv has 20 career touchdown catches and owns three of

the top-10 receiving yardage games in school history. He finished with a career-high 11 catches for 205 yards, including two touchdowns.

Nebraska and Miami are tied with the second-most national championships since 1970 with 5 each. Alabama has 9 during that span.

Nebraska is playing its first regular season game in the state of Florida since a game at Miami in the 1951 season. The Huskers have played 22 bowl games in the state during that span.

 Nebraska junior Terrell Newby had a breakout game against South Alabama, rushing for 198 yards and two scores and catching an 8-yard TD pass. He earned co-Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week honors for his efforts.

After leading the Huskers with 5 interceptions a season ago, junior safety Nate Gerry (Sioux Falls) has 2 in two games in 2015.
