Fears over slowing growth hammered stocks in the U.S. on Friday and lifted prices of government bonds and other assets seen as safer bets. The selling came a day after the Federal Reserve decided to hold interest rates near zero, citing low inflation and a weak global economy.

ON FRIDAY:

The Dow Jones industrial average fell 290.16 points, or 1.7 percent, to 16,384.58.

The Standard & Poor's 500 index slumped 32.17 points, or 1.6 percent, to 1,958.03.

The Nasdaq composite shed

66.72 points, or 1.4 percent, to 4,827.23.


