National Voter Registration Day Slated

On Sept. 22, Americans will celebrate National Voter Registration Day (NVRD) with a massive 50-state effort to register voters for 2016 General Election Day.

In light of national elections, the theme for this year's National Voter Registration Day is "Celebrating Democracy in America." With a historic presidential election approaching next year, every eligible American voter should exercise his or her right to be heard at the ballot box next year, and National Voter Registration Day is the right place to start by getting registered. That is why communities across the country are planning to use National Voter Registration Day to increase voter participation.

The Protection and Advocacy of Voting Access (PAVA) is a program of South Dakota Advocacy Services (SDAS), the state designated protection and advocacy system for individuals with disabilities in South Dakota. SDAS corporate office is located in Pierre with field offices in Yankton, Sioux Falls and Rapid City.

PAVA Program Director C.J. Moit commented, "South Dakota Advocacy Services is proud to be a National Voter Registration Day partner. In the spirit of the day, South Dakota Advocacy Services will be reaching out to nursing care facilities and Community Support Providers across the state to encourage and assist in registering senior citizens and individuals with disabilities register to vote."

National Voter Registration Day is designed to create an annual moment when the entire nation focuses on registering Americans to exercise their most basic right — the right to vote. More than 356,000 Americans have been registered to vote since the inaugural National Voter Registration Day.

Workers Of All Ages Needed To Fill Role Of CNA In South Dakota

With the graying of America, not only are more people in need of care but increasingly older workers are expected to be providing that care along with filling other jobs in South Dakota.

Sept. 21 marks the start of Employ Older Workers Week as proclaimed by Gov. Dennis Daugaard. By 2020, it is estimated that workers 55 and over will make up 25 percent of the U.S. civilian labor force, marking a 13 percent increase from the year 2000. By 2020, more than 7 percent of the workforce is expected to be people over the age of 65, the traditional retirement age.

One sector that is in need of workers is healthcare. South Dakota's healthcare industry is projected to be among the largest growth industries through 2022. The rate of growth is projected to be nearly 14 percent, double the 7 percent growth projected in total employment for all industries as reported at the state's healthcare careers website (<http://healthcareers.sd.gov>).

One caregiving role in great demand in all corners of the state is that of Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA). Becoming a CNA can take as little as two weeks with online training, onsite clinicals and certification testing, making it within grasp for a variety of ages, including older workers.

"Answering the call to care for the residents in our rural facilities can provide a rewarding career for people of all ages, including those older than 55. CNAs are an important part of the care team and the demand for these workers continues to climb," said Sandy Viau-Williams, executive director of Yankton Rural Area Health Education Center (AHEC).

Yankton Rural AHEC along with a consortium of 11 long-term care facilities wants to help find the workers to become CNAs through its Rural Rewards — A Call to Care project. People interested in becoming a CNA are encouraged to apply for the Rural Re-

wards CNA Training Program. Selected applicants will participate in on-line education, on-site clinicals, skills review and certification testing.

Those applicants accepted into the program and completing the training are expected to seek work at one of the 11 long term care facilities involved in the project. The program is designed to provide flexible and accessible training. Participants keep their present jobs during training. On-line modules are available 24 hours per day. Participants will have options of where to complete the on-site clinicals and skills review, as these sessions are rotated among the facilities teaming up for this project. "We encourage people to call us for more information to learn about the role of a CNA and the great need for these caregivers," said Viau-Williams.
