Chancellor Named MVFC Line-

man Of The Week

VERMILLION — South Dakota senior right tackle Derek Chancellor (McCook, Neb.) has been named Missouri Valley Football Conference Offensive Lineman of the Week for the period ended Sept. 20.

Chancellor graded out as the top lineman for a Coyote team that posted 296 yards rushing and 180 passing during a 52-0 win against Drake Saturday in Vermillion. Chancellor helped the Coyotes average 6.6 yards per carry and 7.3 yards per play. The 52 points were the most by the offense since 2009 and the 476 yards were the most since 2013.

Chancellor has started 29 games for the Coyotes during his four-year career. This is his first MVFC player of the week award.

Freshmen Bucks Earn First Win

Ethan Wishon passed for three touchdowns and rushed for another as the Yankton ninth grade football team beat Norfolk 38-24 on Thursday for its first victory of the season.

Wishon finished 5-6 passing for 95 yards, hitting Rex Ryken for touchdowns of 20 and 28 yards. Sam Mooney caught a 16-yard touchdown strike. The Bucks also got an 8-yard touchdown run from Caid Kozletsky, a 2-yard TD run from Wishon and a 27-yard field goal from Miles Carda, who was also 4-4 on PAT attempts.

Levi Wiersma rushed for a team-best 84 yards on eight carries, Hunter Antrobus rushed for 72 yards on six carries and Kozletsky had 63 yards on seven carries for the Bucks, who finished with 252 yards rushing as a team.

Defensively, Nick Lehl had seven tackles and Connor Brown had an interception, a fumble recovery and a sack to lead the Yankton defense. Kozletsky also recovered a fumble. Wiersma had two sacks, with Dylan Alver and Nick Kurtenbach each recording one.

Yankton, 1-2, hosts Mitchell on Thursday, Sept. 24.
