

Jamal Awadallah had the first goal, tapping in a shot that bounced around in front of the net after a corner kick. Daniel Patterson scored the second after spinning through Yankton defenders and putting a shot past goalkeeper Trevor Rafferty. Daniel Murillo put the Patriots up 3-0 netting a shot off of his back heel.

Yankton had no answer to the Lincoln attack as most of the half was played in the Lincoln offensive half.

Joseph Lopez Santiago added the fourth goal by dibbling past the defenders and beating Rafferty in a one-on-one situation. Just before
