All glass, office paper, junk mail and shredded paper must be taken to the Transfer Station to be recycled. The following items can be picked up curbside: #1 & #2 plastics, tin and aluminum cans, newspaper, magazines and slicks, paperboard and cardboard. All items must be sorted separately within the same can or in separate containers.

BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were lower Monday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for December delivery lost 2.50 cents to \$5.055 a bushel; December corn fell 2.25 cents to 3.8675 a bushel; December oats were off 2 cents to 2.2925 a bushel; while November soybeans shed 12.5 cents to \$8.7675 a bushel. Beef was mixed and pork was mostly higher on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. December live cattle was up .15 cent to \$1.3715 a pound; November feeder cattle fell 15 cent to \$1.8145 a pound; while December lean hogs lost .02 cent to \$.6575 a pound.
