VERMILLION — Authorities believe the body recovered Sunday from the Vermillion River is a Vermillion man missing for two weeks.

Vermillion Police Chief Matt Betzen told the *Vermillion* Plain Talk that law enforcement officials suspect the body is that of 31-year-old Evan Stajduhar.

The body was pulled from the river just south of Vermillion, Betzen said.

Stajduhar was reported missing in mid-September. Authorities have been asking the public's help in locating the man, described on the Vermillion Police Department's Facebook page as 5-foot-11 and about 150 pounds.

Stajduhar had left his residence between 10 p.m. Sept. 16 and 8:30 a.m. Sept. 17, according to the Facebook page. Authorities do not suspect foul play at this time, Betzen told the *Plain Talk*.

The exercise is scheduled to occur Sept. 30-Oct. 1 and may include training maneuvers within the river near Riverside Park during any portion of this period.

The purpose of the exercise is to familiarize emergency responders to the vicinity of the Keystone Pipeline burrowed under the Missouri River bed near Yankton and prepare in the event an in-water spill incident should occur.

This is strictly a precautionary training measure that the company periodically takes in all areas throughout the Coun-


