Body Confirmed To Be That Of Missing Man

VERMILLION — A body found this past weekend in the Vermillion River has been confirmed to be a man who has been missing since mid-September.

On Tuesday, the Vermillion Police Department released the autopsy results on the body, which was found in the river south of Vermillion Sunday by the Vermillion Police, Vermillion Fire Department and Clay County Sheriff's Department.

Autopsy results confirm that the body is that of Evan Stajduhar, 31, who had been missing from his home since Sept. 16.

According to the press release issued by the department, no foul play is suspected.

The obituary for Stajduhar received by the Plain Talk said that he had lived in Vermillion since January.

Funeral arrangements are pending with Kroeger Funeral Home in Logansport with Hansen Funeral Home in Vermillion handling local arrangements.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were mixed Tuesday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for December delivery lost 1.75 cents to \$5.0375 a bushel; December corn rose 2.25 cents to 3.89 a bushel; December oats were off 2.75 cents to 2.2650 a bushel; while November soybeans gained 7.50 cents to \$8.8425 a bushel.

Beef was lower and pork was higher on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. December live cattle was off 3 cents to \$1.3415 a pound; November feeder cattle fell 4.50 cents to \$1.7695 a pound; while December lean hogs gained 1.30 cents to \$6.705 a pound.
